This Agreement Made this 30th day of October in the year 1868, between James B. Vick, & Lucy M. Vick, both of the County of Southampton, Wm. S. Scott, that whereas the acts of Matrimony are shortly to be solemnized between the said two parties, and whereas the said Lucy M. Vick is seized & possessed of certain real and personal estate the legal rights to which it is desired by both parties, shall not be impaired by the said Matrimony. In consideration of the premises, the said James B. Vick releases and relinquishes all right, title or interest of every kind, in law or equity, which he might otherwise acquire in and to any property real, personal or mixed of which the said Lucy M. Vick, may now be seized & possessed or may hereafter accumulate. And the said James B. Vick, consents that the said Lucy M. Vick shall now, enjoy, control and dispose of all such property of every kind of which she may now be seized & possessed or which she may hereafter acquire, in the same manner in all respects, as if she were an unmarried Woman. That the said James B. Vick, shall obtain no rights therein except such as may be granted by the said Lucy M. Vick. That the said Lucy M. Vick shall have the right to bargain & contract as to all her said property, to dispose of the same by Sale, Deed of Gift, Last Will & Testament, or otherwise as a feme sole might do. And the said James B. Vick, further consents & agrees that the said Lucy M. Vick shall not be deprived of her right of dower or any other legal right to which she might become entitled in or to any estate real or personal which the said James B. Vick, may now possess or may hereafter acquire, but the said Lucy M. Vick shall have and enjoy the same just as if this Agreement had never been entered into.
