This Deed made this 11th day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred & sixty eight between Benjamin B. Kendrick and Joseph H. Barkham of the first part, and John A. Sackler, of the other part; Witness as follows: Whereas the said Benjamin B. Kendrick did by Deed of Trust recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, on the 10th day of May A.D. 1866, among other things, grant and convey to E. W. Mapsonburg as Trustee, a certain tract of Land which is described in the said deed of Trust in the following words to wit: All that tract of Land on which the said B. B. Kendrick now resides, lying near Stephens Depot, supposed to contain six hundred and fifty acres, more or less, and bounded by the Lands of Mills A. Smith, William Tyler Bryant, Corbett Bryant & others;— Where said tract of Land was conveyed to the said Mapsonburg in Trust to secure the payment of a certain debt due to the said Joseph H. Barkham; and whereas the said Kendrick has, with the approbation and consent of the said Barkham, this day bargained and sold the said tract of Land and the same to the said Sackler: And this Deed of Trust, that the herein described to the said Benjamin B. Kendrick and Joseph H. Barkham for and in consideration of the sum of Three thousand and two hundred dollars, paid to them by the said John A. Sackler: The receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, doth grant and convey to the said John A. Sackler, all of the said tract of Land hereinbefore described.

The said Joseph H. Barkham grants and conveys to the said Sackler only such right, title and interest as he may have in and to the said tract of Land by virtue of the said Deed of Trust. And the said Benjamin B. Kendrick grants and conveys the said tract of Land to the said John A. Sackler with general warranty, that is to say, against the claims and demands of all persons whatsoever. Witness the following Signatures and Seals.
