Wm. A. W. Storflak died on the 23rd day of April one thousand eight hundred and Sixty six, executed a Deed of Trust which was duly recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, Conveying to Sustin R. Edwards as trustee certain parcels or tracts of real property Situated in the aforesaid County, and by authority of which death, a Sale of said property was made the first day of October One thousand eight hundred and Sixty eight, and said A. W. Storflak bearing for the sum of One thousand five hundred dollars, towards the purchase of one of the aforesaid tracts of land. Said tract adjoining the village of Steinhurst, to the West Side and adjoining the Blawater water river, and adjoining the lands of John Parker and others, it being the tract in which the said Storflak resided at the time of the above mentioned Conveyance and in which he now resided, and which was first purchased by him of the said Sustin R. Edwards for Wm. Murphy, containing by estimation one hundred and forty six acres more or less. Therefor this Deed made this 19th day of October, one thousand eight hundred and Sixty eight between the said Sustin R. Edwards, Trustee, of the one part, and the said A. W.
