

This Deed made this 18th day of November 1868, between Byles S. Gray the grantor, of the first part, and William Gandy (Trustee) of the other, witnesseth, that the said Byles S. Gray, doth grants unto the said William Gandy, the following property to wit; all his right, title and interest, of, in and to a certain tract of land, lying in Southampson County, containing 304 acres, and bounded on the North by the land of John Sharp, east and south by the lands of P. Gandy and Jacob Williams and West by the lands of Wm. Bryant and James Gray. It being a tract of lands which formerly belonged to James J. Gray and sold by George Fiske, Commissioner, and now in the possession of the grantor Byles S. Gray. Two barrels of corn, two stacks of blade fodder, two Peas and ten Pigs. In trust, to secure the following debts, the sum due Wm. J. Gray, senior, of Nancy Gray debt for \$36.25 due 15th of June 1866, a bond executed to J. G. Ridley for \$150 - due 15th of March 1867, and now held by Wm. J. Gray, and a bond for about \$30. due G. W. Fiske - and the said Byles S. Gray, doth warrant the said property generally to the said William Gandy, as witnesseth the following signatures and seals.
