Porflut and Indiana D. his wife do grant unto the said John Ingham, Trustee as aforesaid the following real Estate to wit; a tract of Land in Southampton County containing by estimation two hundred and twenty two acres, more or less, and is situated adjoining the Village of Franklin and on the west side of Blackwater River (adjoining the same) and adjoins the Lands of John Ingham, William Davis & others, and is the same premises on which the said Porflut now resides and was originally purchased by him of E.
