Bryant, as Trustees, as aforesaid, in pursuance of the provisions of said Deed of Trust, proceeded to advertise the said Land and afforementioned, in every respect as required by said Deed, and did, on the premises, on the 5th day of November 1868, Sell at auction for Cash, according to Law, the above described tract of Land and appurtenances, Subject to a Judgment rendered on March Term 1865, of said County in favor of Dr. E. Moore, Executor, for Dr. S. Barnes' benefit, for \$815.80, & interest from 16th March 1858. When the same was purchased by Jordan Lewis Pittlow, for the sum of Fourteen hundred and fifty dollars.
