This Agreement Made & entered into this 13th day of February in the year one thousand Eight hundred & Sixty Nine between John Whitehead of Southampton County State of Virginia, of the first part & Rebecca A. Turner, of the said County & State aforesaid, of the second part, Whereby That whereas Marriage is about to be had & solemnized between the said John Whitehead & the said Rebecca A. Turner, & the said John Whitehead is desirous of providing for a suitable & proper settlement upon, & for the use, benefit & behoof of the said Rebecca his intended wife; Now therefore, the said John Whitehead with hereby Covenant & agree, that, if the Marriage be intended, shall be had & solemnized & that in the event of the said Rebecca being the longest lived, he the said John Whitehead leaves to the said Rebecca his wife, a certain parcel of land situated at the North West end of the of the said John Whitehead's place, containing fifty acres west of the part that lies from the said John Whitehead to the place known as the Corner place belonging to Geo. C. Borden, & runs to the South East corner of the yard, where B. B. Soy had been, thence South to three peach trees in a field known as the gun field & still further South to the Eight apple row in the apple Orchard, continuing from the North side of the Orchard, thence down the said Eight and in a westerly direction to a ditch in a field known as the Adams field, thence down said ditch South to the said branch, thence down said South branch to Powell Branch adjoining the land of B. C. Soy, thence up Powell branch to C. H. Harrison's line, thence along A. G. Harrison's line to Geo. C. Borden's line, thence along Geo. C. Borden's line to the point of Commencement said parcel of land containing two hundred & fifty acres, more or less. No land, or that said parcel of land described in Natural words, is to be cleared down for Cultivation. The said John Whitehead, further agree, to give to the said Rebecca, after his death she being the longest lived, two hundred or upwards, in few sheep, just whereever she may select, two head & calf, one head & pig, twenty five barrels of corn, three hundred pounds
