This Agreement made & entered into this 13th day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred & Sixty nine between John Whitehead of Southampton County State of Virginia, of the first part & Rebecca A. Turner, of the said County & State aforesaid, of the second part, witnesseth That whereas Marriage is about to be had & solemnized between the said John Whitehead & the said Rebecca A. Turner, & the said John Whitehead is desirous of providing for a Suitable & proper Settlement after, & for the use, benefit & behoof of the said Rebecca his intended wife; Now therefore, the said John Whitehead doth hereby Convene & agree, that if the Marriage so intended, shall be had & solemnized & that in the event of the said Rebecca being the longest living, he the said John Whitehead leaving to the said Rebecca his wife, @ certain parcels of land situated in the York area end of the of the said John Whitehead's plantation, commencing fifty yards west of the path that leads from the said John Whitehead's to the place known as the Jones place belonging to Geo. E. Bratt, & runs to the South East corner of the yard, where B. B. Jones now lives, thence with to the South West corner of the garden, where the said B. B. Jones lives, thence South to the shore peach trees in a field known as the give fields & still further South to the eight apple trees in the apple orchard, running from the North side of the orchard, thence down the said eight and in a westerly direction to a ditch in a field known as the Adam field, thence down said ditch South to the said branch, thence down said branch to Fowells Branch adiring the said of B. E. Ipo, thence up Fowells branch to C. J. Harrison's line, thence along A. J. Harrison's line to Geo. E. Bratt's line, thence along Geo. E. Bratt's line to the point of commencement. Said parcel of land containing two hundred & fifty acres, no rod or less. No Lanes, or the said parcel of land described in Natural Woods, is to be cleared down for cultivation. The said John Whitehead, further agrees, to give to the said Rebecca, after her death, the largest tree, two hundred & fifty, in few single, just whichever she may select, two Cent & Calf, two bushels & peyz.
