Witnessed, that for & in consideration of the sum of five hundred & fifty dollars, the said Joseph B. Davis & Elyse Gano his wife do grant, bargain & convey unto the said George W. Williams the following tracts or parcels of Land, containing by estimation One hundred & two acres, & bounded & described as follows, Viz. The tract or parcel of two acres of land this day conveyed to the said Joseph B. Davis by William Whitehead & wife, & the other parcel of one hundred acres, beginning at a point on the road 79 Poles from the Old Branch, running thence S. 77. W to the Appomattock Swamp, or the tract by the Appomattock Swamp, or the tract by the land of Wm Whitehead & on the East by the road leading from Petersburg to Charlottesville. And the said Joseph B. Davis does hereby covenant unto the said George W. Williams, that he is seized in fee of the foregoing premises & that he will forever warrant & defend the title to the same against the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever.
