This Deed made this 28th day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred & sixty, between Missouri A. Ireland & Elizabeth R. Ireland of the first part & Robert St. Ireland of the second part, all of the County of Surry in the State of Virginia, do Certify that the said Missouri A. Ireland & Elizabeth R. Ireland, in consideration of the sum of Two thousand Dollars, did grant unto general warranty to the said Robert St. Ireland, their undivided interest in & to tracts of Land of which Joseph Ireland deceased, (their father) did possess, containing two hundred & seventy acres, more or less, lying & being in the County of Surry Virginia, adjoining the Lands of Sarah Bailey. The said formerly Alfred S. Bailey deceased & others; also two hundred & thirty acres of Land lying & being in the County of Southampton Virginia, adjoining the Lands of D. H. Woodcock, & others, the said two grantors of said Elizabeth the tract of six hundred acres of Land, more or less, upon which said Joseph Ireland resided at the time of his death & which by his will (only recorded in the Clerk's Office of Surry County, Va.) he bequeathed to Robert St. Ireland, & said Missouri A.
