Sixty, between Missouri A. Irwin & Elizabeth R. Irwin of the first part of Robert
St. Irwin of the second part, all of the County of Surry in the State of Virginia, witnesseth,
that the said Missouri A. Irwin & Elizabeth R. Irwin, in consideration of
the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, doth grant with general warranty to the
said Robert St. Irwin, their undivided interest in & to tract of Land of
which Joseph Irwin deceased, (their father) died possessed, containing Two
hundred & Sixty acres, more or less, lying & being in the County of Surry
Virginia, adjoining the lands of Sarah Bailey. The lands formerly of Joseph S.
Bailey deceased & others, also two hundred & Thirty acres of land lying &
being in the County of Southampton Virginia, adjoining the lands of R. G. Howard
