Kindred, commonly known as the "Bordings" place bounded by the said road & by the said of Miles Morris, Lewis Davis & others, supposed to contain five hundred & fifty acres more or less; & as this is included the small tract of land lately purchased by John J. Hinckley, it aforesaid, known as the John Stony place, immediately adjoining the said "Bordings" place, & in full to secure the payment of a sum for some account due to the said John W.
