in the year 1866, it was deemed & ordered by the Circuit Court of the County of Gloucester,  
in a certain cause then depending at the Chancery Side of said Court between William C.  
Wrightson, Plaintiff & Kenneth M. Wrightson & others defendants, that the said John
