said Benjamin C. Morris, the said John C. Thomas & his wife aforesaid do
grant also the said Benjamin C. Morris, his wife in the town of Jerusalem,
in the County of Southampton, known as the "Drumgold Old Hotel,"
which said the said John C. Thomas purchased of Mr. Morris, in
the year 1813, containing two acres, 31 rods & less, together with all the
appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any way appertaining; to have
& to hold the same for ever, the right & title to the same & premises we
