Eight & 1/3 acres, bounded by the lands of Burton & Francis, Miss Polly Gray,
& Mary A. Robbins. To the said Benjamin Johnson & O'Donnell
& Mary Jane his wife do relinquish all right title & interest
in the said land forever unto the said Franklin Dicks.
