 of the Just. Pow. of the United States to the amount of fifty cents being affixed
 thereto & duly acknowledged.

This Deed made this 19th day of May A.D. 1819, between John Groote Jr., Special
 Commissioner of the first part and W. W. Colly, of the second part, Whereas at the
 November Term of the Circuit Court of the County of Southampton in the year 1816, it was
 directed & Ordered by the Said Court, in a certain cause then depending at the Chancery
 Side of said Court, between William C. Vaughan, Plaintiff & Newbold M.
 Vaughan & others, Defendants, that the Said John Groote Jr., Commissioner appointed
 by the said Court, shall sell at public auction the certain tract of Land commonly
 called "The Apawooocke Tract," belonging to the Estate of A. D. Vaughan, deceased,
 upon the following terms to wit: One fifth Cash, & the residue at Credit by
 one & two years, with interest from the day of Sale. The purchaser giving
 bond with good personal security, & the bill to be retained until the further
 Order of the Court, and Whereas, the Said John Groote Jr., Commissioner, on
 the 29th day of December 1816, in pursuance of the said decree, did offer
 for sale at public auction the said Apawooocke tract, containing by estimation
 above two thousand & Ninety acres, in two parcels, after hearing adu-
 erged the time & place of sale as directed by the said decree, at which sale
 the parcel of the said Apawooocke tract containing by estimation Eight
 hundred & Twenty four acres, was struck off, to the Said W. W. Colly, for
 the sum of One Thousand four hundred dollars, and whereas, the whole of
 the purchase money for the said piece or parcel of Land has been paid
 by the said W. W. Colly, and whereas the Said John Groote Jr., Commissioner,
 as aforesaid, was directed by a decree of the said Court, at its May Term
 1819, to carry the same to the purchaser,
 Now This Indenture, Witnesseth, that the Said John Groote Jr., Commissioner
 as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said decree, in consideration of the
 premises and of the said sum of Two Thousand & Four Hundred Dollars,
 to him in hand paid by the Said W. W. Colly, hath granted, bargained
 & sold, & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the Said W. W.
 Colly, his heirs & assigns the said piece or parcel of Land containing by
 estimation Eight hundred & Twenty four acres, lying in the County of
 Southampton & bounded as follows; to wit; Contouring on the Latin
 Point Road, where the Mill Branch crosses the said road, up the said
 road to Buffins Bridge, up the Mill Stream from the said Bridge to
 where C. J. Williams' line commences, On the East by the Land of
 C. J. Williams & to the South by the Lands of H. D. Turner, the
 heirs of Richard Williams & the said W. W. Colly. To have & to
 hold the said pieces or parcels of Land to the said W. W. Colly, his
 heirs & assigns forever. And the said John Groote Jr., Commissioner as aforesaid,
 warrants specially the Land to be free from all incumbrances excepting the following signature
