Williams for certain considerations of the Nature law & affords that he bears for his nephew the said Henry C. Moore, doth grant unto him the said Henry C. Moore, one tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton, containing 172 1/2 acres, more or less, known as the Davis tract, & adjoining the Land of said William L. Williams, Charles E. Williams, James H. Davis & others; the said grant is made up the Special Warranty & hath the following Signatures & Seals.

This Agreement Made this 28th June in the year 1819, between James H. Jordan & John Dorton of the first part & Edward Mattison of the other part, of the County of Southampton, that the said parties of the first part have this day sold to the said Mattison, party of the second part, all the Saw timber of every kind whatsoever being & standing on the Land of the said parties, of the size of twelve inches & upwards at the butt (the usual place of cutting timber above the ground,) that is to say, on that portion of the tract of Land belonging to the said parties of the first part lying & situated in the County of Southampton, immediately on the Mattison River, the whole tract consisting of four hundred acres, more or less, and the woodlands, on which the timber does stand, is supposed to contain two hundred acres, more or less, but the exact line indicating how far the present
