This Deed made this fourth day of August, in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred & Sixty Nines between Thomas St. Croft of the first part, Geo. J. Kindred (Trustee) of the second part, and Joseph St. Barham of the third part, Witnesses; That the said Thomas St. Croft, doth hereby grant & convey to the said Kindred, the following property, to wit: That tract or parcel of Lands lying in the County of Southampton, supposed to contain about Two hundred acres, more or less, and bounded to the North by Jordan Edwards & Joshua Dickson, on the East by the Village of Franklin and Alexander W. Perkins, on the South by John Perkins and Spicers Beale and on the West by James Tillard & Alfred Cobb; it being the same tract of Lands which was given & devised to the said Thomas St. Croft by his Father now deceased; In Trust, to Secure the payment of a promissory Note for the Sum of One Thousand Dollars of said date with this Deed, due to the said Joseph St. Barham by "Immy Brothers & Co." Merchants, of Franklin, the said Thomas St. Croft being the junior Member of said firm. Witness the following Signatures & Seals.

Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton County, made at the November Term 1819, of said Court, in the Cause therein pending, between Wm. S. Goodwyn is Plaintiff and Edwards W. Mapantury & others, Defendants, it was given and Ordered that Saml. Kelso, the Sheriff of said County, proceed to sell before the Court house door of Southampton County, at said Court day, the tract of Lands referred to therein as a tract of Two hundred & four acres, lying belonging to George W. Deale, and purchased by him of James W. Perkins, and bounded by the Lands of Thomas Widley & Harris of Pope, & on the East by the Millway River, as the terms set forth in said Decree; And Whereas the said Saml. Kelso, in pursuance of said Decree proceeded to advertise the said Lands in the manner directed by said Decree, and did on the 15th day of April 1818,
