This Deed made this 27th of February 1819, between George W. Vick, the grantor of
the one part & William J. Spray of the other, Whereas the County Court of Southampton
did by its decree of November 1817, appoint G. W. Vick Commissioner to sell the
land whereof James Spray died seignior & proprietor & direct him to sell the purchase
money to make the purchase & set & return the said Vick did sell the
said land & the said spray purchased the same of said Vick in Southampton County containing
200 acres, more or less, & has paid for the same - Now therefore this said Vick doth certify
that in consideration of the sum of \$1955. to the said G. W. Vick, in hand paid
by the said William J. Spray, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the
said G. W. Vick doth grant unto William J. Spray @ tract of Land in
Southampton County containing two hundred & twenty six acres, more or less, lying
in the Indian Woods & bounded on the north by the land Mrs. Sallie B. Hamilton,
East by the highway, West & the land of Alexander Stewart, South by the land
of Thomas Crockett & West by the land of Mrs. Sallie B. Starnes & Edward
W. Mapenbury - And the said George W. Vick doth hereby warrant & defend
unto the said William J. Spray such title as is vested in him by the aforesaid decree
of the County Court of Southampton, & none other, as witness the following
Signature & Seal.

part & Harry Bards of the other part, Whereas the County Court of Southampton
did by its decree of the said Harry Bards, in consideration of the sum of
five dollars the said Thomas St. Croft, doth grant unto the said Harry Bards, @
contains tract of Land containing about two & @ quarter acres, lying near Bards
in the County of Southampton bounded as follows, beginning at the corner of @ ditch
on the line of the land conveyed to the said Harry Bards by the said Thomas St. Croft,
by Deed dated the 20th of February, 1818, & running thence Northward to the road
thence North-East along the road to a fence, thence South-East, to the line of the
tract of Land conveyed as aforesaid by Thomas St. Croft to the said Harry Bards, thence
South to the beginning @ land for the use & separate use & benefit, first of
Martha J. Bards, the wife of W^o C. Bards & the Children which she now has or
may hereinafter acquire, by the said W^o C. Bards free from all debts or liabilities
