This Deed made the 13th day of August Eighteen hundred & Sixty Nine between Dempsey
Johnson of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, of the first part, & Spikes,
Beale of the County of Isle of Wight State of Virginia, of the second part, whipping
that in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred (\$800) dollars, the said Dempsey
Johnson, doth grant unto the said Spikes Beale, all his right title & interest in
certain tract of Land lying in the said County of Southampton, containing one hundred
& forty five acres. More or less, & bounded as follows; by the Lands of William
A. Mapleton & John Moore, to the west, by the lands of Sam Morris & Benjamin
Cunningham, to the south, by the lands of John Williams, to the east, & to the west
of said Mapleton & W.M. & S. St. Griffins in the north. It being the portion of
the tract of land bought by said Johnson of Joseph E. Gillette on the 17th day
of June 1856, in which said Johnson resided. The remainder of said tract having
