This Deed made the Sabbath day of September in the year One thousand Eight hundred & Sixty Nine between Benj. B. Kendrick, (Grantor) of the first part & John McKensley (Grantee) of the second part; Witnessed, that the said Grantor for & in consideration of the sum of Three thousand & Four hundred Dollars (\$3400.00) to him paid by the said Grantee, the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, doth grant & convey to the said John McKensley, all that tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton State of Virginia near Boykins Dept. Supposed to contain Five hundred and Sixty (960) acres, more or less, and bounded by the Public Road leading from Boykins Dept. to Murfreesboro, by Maherrin River, & by the hand of Thomas Pickney, William M. Beal & others and commonly known as Middlebrook to have & to hold the said tract of Land together with all the privileges and appurtenances in any wise belonging to the same, to him the said John McKensley and his heirs forever, free from the claims, demands or interference of all persons whomsoever.
