

This Deed made the 14th day of January in the year 1817, between Kenneth M. Waggoner and Mary D. his wife of the first part and James Crockett, Colonel of the second part, Winchester, that in consideration of \$200.00 Two hundred and fifty dollars, the said K. M. Waggoner and Mary D. his wife, of the first part, do grant unto the said James Crockett of the second part, all right, title and interest, whatsoever, in a certain piece or parcel of land known as the "Old Farmers" tract containing by recent survey about (80) Fifty acres, and bounded on the North, East, South and West by the lands of K. M. Waggoner. The line of said lands begins at a Spruce tree on Sarrapin Swamp and runs S. Eastward to a pine, and Westward to a pine, and thence Northward to a pine, and so Northward by a pine to a Spruce in said Sarrapin Swamp, which is the Northern boundary.
