This Deed made this 9th day of November in the year 1869, between Josephine T.
Howard grantor of the one part and William B. Shantz, trustee of the other, stipulating,
that the said Josephine doth and doth grant unto the said William B. Shantz, the
following property to wit, certain lots of land and houses, no the same, lying
and situated in the town of Orange, Southampton County, Virginia, known as the
Hart lot and house and described as follows; beginning at the York West corner
adjoining the house known as the Mahone house, thence in a direction
North East along the line of the said building, kitchen and smoke house,
passing a large specimen tree to a small specimen tree, and the line of the
fence forming the rear and eastern boundary of the said lot, thence in a
direction South East along the said fence and in the rear of a line
of trees to an intersection with the division line between the said
lot and the Richfield Estate, thence along the line of the Richfield
Estate for the lots and gardens, fence following the course of the fence
out to the shrub and public square and thence along the public square
in a Northern direction to the point of beginning - It being
the lot purchased by Josephine T. Howard of Samuel Hart.
Also certain lots of property and buildings situated and lying in
the town of Jonesville, Southampton County, Virginia, adjoining the Hart
lot to the North side known as the Mahone house which said lots
containing two acres and a half, adjoining the Hart lot, the stone house
and office belonging to the estate of John G. Mahone, the
lawn belonging to John Barkman and the lots on which is situated
Toper Hotel now occupied by R. E. Darden, it being the lots of land
purchased by Josephine T. Howard of John G. Mahone.
In trust, to secure the following debt, £ 1000 British hundred dollars,
due Benjamin E. Pips, dated the 9th day of November 1869, £ 1000
British hundred and Eighty dollars, my demand the first of January
1871, and carrying interest from the first of January 1870, and dated the
9th day of November 1869. And it is hereby covenanted and agreed by all
the parties to this Deed that Josephine T. Howard, shall retain quiet and
peaceable possession of the lands and premises above set forth
January 1871, when upon default made in the payment of the said bond,
upon the request of either R. E. Pips, Samuel Hart, their representatives
or assigns, the said Wm. B. Shantz, shall after giving at least thirty
days notice by public advertisement, proceed to sell at the public
or public auction, to the highest bidder, for cash, the above said lots
and premises, and after paying the expenses of the execution of this
bond including a commission of five per cent to the trustee, pay to
Benjamin E. Pips and Samuel Hart the lots above mentioned
and the balance of any money due to Josephine T. Howard.
