the said William St. Pittler for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty four hundred
dollars, gold and lawful money of the United States to him in hand paid by the said
Bain & Drew at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, has granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth
grant bargain and sell unto the said Bain & Drew five Scrabs of certain pines
or parcel of Land called the "Cotton Tract" lying and being in the County of Newfane
now containing by estimation two hundred and twenty five acres, and adjoing
the lands of J. B. Urquhart, A. St. Holloman, Thomas Thorne and others. Giving
the same tract of Land that was conveyed by Alexander Gairard and Martha
his wife to C. F. and A. B. Urquhart by Deed bearing date the 10th day of
September 1817, and by John Gould Jr., Specie Counterporter and by William
Urquhart and Joseph W. Urquhart Executors of C. F. Urquhart deceased to
the said William St. Pittler by Deed bearing date the 10th day of September
1817, to which Deed reference is hereby made for a more particular
description to have and to hold the said five Scrabs of land pines or
parcel of Land unto the said "Bain & Drew" their heirs and assigns forever
And the said William St. Pittler, covenants that he will warrant
