part of a certain saw mill situated on the Stonewall River, in Suffolk  
County, Virginia, known as the Stonewall Saw Mill, together with one undivided  
one third part of the land and appurtenances thereto belonging and appertaining  
All being the same property described in the article of agreement bearing  
date the first day of June A.D. 1817, and now and then incorporated  
into the same between the said John B. Hickey and Edward E. Hickey of said Suffolk  
County, Virginia, and Lewis M. Dunning of Chicago Illinois —  
In Bond he stands to Lewis M. Dunning of Chicago, Illinois for  
sum of Two Thousand Dollars, with interest from the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of  
October aforesaid, and as further evidence by these presents,  
Vouchers of said date herewith for the sum of two Thousand Dollars each,  
and due on the first day of May & September 1870, and the first
