 Now therefore this date of this 1<sup>st</sup> day of December in consideration of the premises and the further consideration of our doctor, the said Samuel J. Hand, will grant and give B. Shantz, trustee as aforesaid, a certain tract of land known as the Hornbeam tract, containing 750 acres, more or less, a tract of land known as the Holly tract, containing 353 acres, more or less, and a tract of land known as the Old Rock's tract, containing 300 acres, more or less, all the said lands being situated and lying in Southampton County, and bordering on the Northway River, and the Seaboard & Roanoke Rail road. In trust, to secure the following bond, to wit; a bond for two thousand dollars, dated the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 1849, to demand the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 1870, carrying interest from date, given by Samuel J. Hand to Wm. A. Mapenburg and James P. Mapenburg, and a bond for two thousand dollars, dated the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 1849, to demand the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 1871, carrying interest from date, and given by Samuel J. Hand to Wm.
