This Indt. Made this 18 day of December in the year One Thousand Eight hundred and Sixty Nine, between Eliza A. Bishop, (Groom) of the one part and James L. Bishop (Groom) of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Eliza A. Bishop, doth grant unto the said James L. Bishop, Groom, the following property, viz, Three horses, Two Mules, fifty barrels of Corn, Five Thousand pounds of fodder, thirty eight hogs, four Sows and twenty pigs, Eighteen heads of cattle, one Ox, fifteen Sheep, three Cows and Whelps, six plows, six axes, five wheel hoes, three grub hoes, six iron wedges, six hoes and furniture one Sled board, fifteen chairs, two Sofas, two Chairs, four trunks, one Kettle, five Pils, two Wrens, two Spiders, one Stone, six tables, twenty five bushels of Peas, also my interest in Miles Slippy's Estate.
