Witnesseth, that the said Charles E. Bryant and Mary J. Bryant his

and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to them
in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,
have granted, bargained and sold unto the said Joseph G. Holland, his heirs
and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of Land, situate,
lying and being in the County and State aforesaid and containing
by estimation two hundred and fifty acres, more or less, and
bounded by the lands of Capt. John S. Root, Samuel S. Whitely,
Willie Dicks and others, it being the lands of which Joseph Ferguson
deceased devised and bequeathed and sold by Capt. James Barnes his
Executor, Legatee, Heir, acknowledged and delivered the day and year
first above writing in the presence of us -
