This Deed of Bargain & Sale from Charles E. Bryan and wife and Gordon C. Whitfield and wife to Joseph H. Hollands, was this day reviewed and together with the Certificates thereto annexed of the acknowledgments of the said Charles E. Bryan and Gordon C. Whitfield, before a Justice of the Peace out of the proper examination and acknowledgments of the Wives before the Justice, admitted to record. A Stamp of the Pub. Sec. of the U.S. to the amount of two dollars, being affixed thereto and duly cancelled.

To the Circuit Court of the County of Northampton,
Whereas, we the undersigned Commissioners, did in a former report on the division of the lands of the Widow of Thomas Hall and her heirs to define the line as two feet simple and down right in the land lying in Southampton County Va. where no other was made. We then having no directions to employ a Surveyor by said decree, and by the request of the attorney in said proceeding, we did on the 11th day of October 1818, employ J. C. Wells, a Surveyor of the County of Southampton to Survey the White tract, and it is as follows, to wit, Commencing at a Stone and Oak on the Franklin road, running the various courses to a Pine joining Wm. Neely; thence the line running the various courses to the Franklin road, down said road to the said Oak beginning of said Station, Making two hundred and fifty five and a half acres. Thence run a dividing line from the said Oak, commencing at a post near the Church, running to a White Oak, to the line of said Hall and Neely, Making one hundred and twenty four and three fourths acres, in each track. We then set apart the North of the line for the widows few simple in the land. We then cut off fifty two acres from the other track, which belongs to the Estate of Thomas Hall, lying on the Franklin road, which we formerly reported, as in the land in Case of Wright for her dower all of which were to be done by the plan herewith annexed. The Surveyor was employed two days in Surveying the land and two chain bearings - all of which we respectfully submit as a part of our reports.
