Harrison partners trading under the name style and firm of Bealme & Harrison of the second part, witnessed that for and in consideration of the sum of five thousand four hundred dollars to them in hand paid and secured to be paid, by the parties of the second part, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, they the said parties of the first part, have given, granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and do by these presents, give, grant, bargain & sell, convey unto the said parties of the second part, and their heirs forever, a certain tract or parcel of land, situate as "Brykins Farm", lying and being in the Counties of Southampton Virginia, and at Southampton N. C. Consisting of one thousand and fifty acres, more or less, and bounded as follows, that is to say, beginning at the Brykins Bridge over the Meherrin River and bounded on the west by the road from said bridge to Brykins Depot, on the north by a branch which constitutes the line between said tract and the estate of Henry Kinard, on the East by the land belonging to the estate of Josiah Worrell & of Henry Cooks divided and on the South by the Meherrin River, for a more particular description of which reference is hereby made to deed from A. S. Williams and W. S. Phillips to Geo. B. Cary, of record in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southampton; to have and to hold the said tract of land, the said Wm. Bealme and John W. Harrison and their heirs - And the said parties of the first part, Covenant on Warrant and defend forever, the premises heretofore conveyed, against the claims or claiming of any and all persons whatsoever, And whereas of the said purchased money, the sum of Twelve hundred dollars remains unpaid and due on the 30th day of Decr. in the year 1870, therefore the said J. W. Waples and M. F. On this 30th day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, before me, John H. Kelly, a Commissioner appointed by the State of North Carolina, in and for the State of Virginia, came J. W. Waples and M. F. Waples his wife, grandsons named in the foregoing Deed of Conveyance, and the said Deed being likewise produced and exhibited before me, they, the said J. W. Waples and M. F. Waples, acknowledged the due execution thereof by them as their act and deed, and thereupon the said M. F. Waples being by me privately examined, separately and apart from her said husband, touching her free consent in the execution of the said Deed of Conveyance, in her said examination declared, that she had executed the same freely, of her own will and accord, and without any force, fear or undue influence of her said husband, or any other person, and did still voluntarily appear thereto, At Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and
