Taylor, the (Seal) Thomas Hanks, the following property to wit: a tract or parcel of land in said County of Sunderland, containing by estimation two hundred acres, more or less, and adjoining the Land of John W. Taylor, James S. Peters and others, and whereas the said George S. Camp has paid the sum of money and all interests due thereon, and now desires a Release of said Land. This said Thomas Hanks this 17th day of November 1849, known the said John W. Taylor, as (Seal) as aforesaid of the one part, and the said George S. Camp of the other part, Witnesseth that the said John W. Taylor, as (Seal) as aforesaid, by and with the consent and authority of the said Jacobus E. Holland, (Seal) by his signing this aforesaid deed, release and release unto the said George S. Camp and to his heirs and assigns forever the Land aforesaid and its appurtenances. This Deed made this 22nd day of December 1849, between W. W. Briggs, (Seal) Commissioner appointed by a Deed of the County Court of Sunderland County made to a November Term 1849, to sell the Land of which N. S. Adams does possess, bounded by the first part, and Richard Clements of the second part, Witnesseth that as requested the said W. W. Briggs, Commissioner as aforesaid, in pursuance of said Deed, did deliver said Land and sold the same on the 20th day of January 1850.

Toward the said W. W. Briggs, Richard Clements, became the purchaser of the tract of Land known as the homestead, lying in the East Side of Plagnum Swamp, containing by estimation three hundred and fifty acres, more or less, for the sum of Eight Hundred and Twenty five dollars.
