H. King and William Under my hands and seal this 20th day of December A. D. 1857.

Stephenson, his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton, containing by estimation Six Hundred and Sixty acres, more or less, it being the same Tract of Land purchased by the said Benjamin E. Worrell from D. C. Barrett and wife as well appear by Deed of Record from said Barrett and wife, to said Worrell, in the year 1846. And the said Benjamin E. Worrell, will forever warrant and defend the title to above described Tract of Land, against the claims of himself, and all persons whatsoever. Witness the following Signatures and Seal.
