This Due made the first day of January 1870, between Henry Rickis  
of the one part, Davis Story, the Trustee of the other part, witnesseth that  
the Henry Rickis don't grant unto the said Davis Story, with general  
Warranty, all my houses, barns and kitchen, furniture, carts, and what  
ever horses, Cows and fodder, all my hogs and other increase, to him  
to secure @ debt due by Bank of forty Nine and Twenty Two Cents,  
to Zachariah Rickis, bearing date the first day of January 1870,

Made by a Deed of the Circuit Court of Southampton, made at the May Term  
1868, in the cause between plaintiff wherein Horace & Co. and others and complaint  
ants and W<sup>m</sup> St. Dauphin et al. of Elizabethtown and others and  
Defendants. It was found and ordered that same little, Sheriff of Southampton  
County, present & below the Land known to have purchased by E. C. Barrett  
under former Deed made in said cause and in the name Horace & Co.  
and which said land sold was the Land of which Elizabethtown  
said Land and property and more in after described, and whereof item  
said same little as Sheriff and Commissioner aforesaid, in execution  
of said Deed proceeded to advertise the said Land and sale on the  
17<sup>th</sup> day of August 1868, before the Probate door of said County  
Saw said Land in the name named in said Deed, whom John W. Beale  
became the highest bidder and purchased at the price of Two Thousand  
one hundred and fifty five dollars, of which he paid in cash of 1813  
and executed his bill with W. M. Beale and Geo. E. Beale his Successor  
for the uniform payment; and whereas by a Subsequent Deed
