Whereas Ovaris Vaughan died on the 17th day November 1854, Executed & Test of
Land, to Joseph J. Gardin, (Trustee,) for the benefit of James Wray, to be sold @
Tolls due Said Wray, which said Test was recorded in the Clerk's Office, of Smith-
ampton County on the same day and amongst other property Conveyed in said Test
was the Tract of Land wherein said Vaughan resided, Containing one hundred and
forty acres, more or less, adjoining the lot of Malcom W. Vaughan testator,
situated in Northway River in Smithampton County, and according to
the stipulations of said Test, the said Joseph J. Gardin, did determine
and set at the highest bidder for Cash, on the 13th day of January 1870,
the Tract of Land above described, and at the sale so made John
Proctor became the purchaser by bidding therefor the sum of
Two Hundred and fifty five Dollars, which was the highest bid,
made for the same - Now this Test made this 13th day of
January 1870, between Joseph J. Gardin of the first party and
John Proctor of the second party, Witnesperk, that the said
Joseph J. Gardin for and in Consideration of Two hundred
and fifty five dollars, to him in hand paid by the said
John Proctor, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
doth grant, bargains and sell unto the said John Proctor
the tract of Land before described, belonging to the
Estate of Ovaris Vaughan, died - And the said Joseph
J. Gardin only Conveys to the said John Proctor, such
title as is Conveyed to him in the Test of Trust before
described and dea forever? Bargain and sell unto the
same - Witness the following Signatures and Seal.
