and twenty five dollars and twenty cents the said Joseph H. Dowry, a certain tract or
parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton, Virginia, and bounded
on the North by the Lands of W. J. Shippens Estate, South by the Lands
of Shugars Laines and Jas Taylor, East by the Lands of R. L. Dotie, and
West by the Lands of Grantham Taylor and Anna Gray and containing
by estimation 23 1/2 acres, now or hereafter to have and to hold the said tract
of Land and its appurtenances to the said Dowry and his heirs forever.
