to said house - In trust to secure to his infant children, John E. Applewhite,  
Benjamin F. Applewhite and Charles H. Applewhite, in sum of \$1500.00  
directed to be paid to them by a decree of the Circuit Court of Suffolk  
of the May Term 1859, and also to secure to Mrs. S. Goddard and Mr.  
B. Stans Commissioning, their rents accumulating from the period  
and interest to appear of three thousand dollars, the same amount  
not being exceeded, and the said John E. Applewhite doth do
