

This Indt made the 23^d day of December in the year 1849, between Charles M. Foyner and Martha A. Foyner his wife of the first part, and William St. Jenkins of the second part, and of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Whicpsh; that in the Consideration of the said of One thousand dollars in hand paid or to be paid unto the said Charles M. Foyner by the said William Jenkins, the said Charles M. Foyner and Martha A. Foyner his wife, doth grant unto the said William St. Jenkins all their right, title and interest in and to a Certain tract or parcel of Land containing by admeasurement four hundred acres, (400) to the same more or less, it being a portion of the Willis College tract, of land and bounded as follows; Commencing in the Road or James P. Jones line, thence along the said line until it strikes a deep branch, thence along said branch to James P. Jones line, thence along James P. Jones line until it strikes Jeffs B. Foyner's line, thence along said line to a white oak at Forked Swamp Church and Richards L. Boykin line, thence along said line to the Road Water neck and down said road to the beginning. The title to said land we warrant and forever defend from Under our hand and Seal at this the day and date above mentioned.
