This Deed made this tenth day of March in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seveny, between Richard J. Dardino & Caroline his wife, and Benjamin E. Wornell of the first part and Joseph B. Prince of the other part, Witsupk, as follows: Whereas the said Richard J. Dardino and Caroline his wife, did by Deed of Trust, admitted to record in the Clerks Office of the County Court of Southampton County, on the 31st January A.D. 1818, grant on Convey to H. B. Skantz Towne for the benefit of the said Wm. E. Wornell real Estate lying in the Village of Crossroads, to wit, the same lot in buildings thereon or which the said Richard J. Dardino and wife now resides, and whereas the said Richard J. Dardino and wife by and with the advice and Consent of the said Benjamin E. Wornell have bargained and sold @ certain portion of the said real Estate to the said Joseph B. Prince. Now this Deed Witsupk, that the said parties of the first part, for and in Consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars to them paid by the said Prince, the receipt whereof said sum is hereby acknowledged, do grant and Convey to the said Joseph B. Prince, that portion of the real Estate before mentioned commonly known as the "White Office", together with the Land there attached, as follows; to wit; the lines formed by each end of the said Office to continue straight to the fence or partition which it presents East off the said Office lot from the garden, in the rear of the said Office; and the said two lines to be continued straight in front to the public road, the said street forming the front line, and the said garden fence forming the rear line. And the said parties of the first part warrant generally the property hereby granted. With the following Signatures and Seals.

Dardino and Caroline Dardino, the wife of the said Richard J. Dardino, appeared before me, in my Office, and being examined by me, privily and apart from her said husband, and having the said Deed fully explained to her, she the said Caroline Dardino acknowledged the same to be her act, and declared that she had executed it willingly and that she does not wish to retract it. Thereupon the said Deed is admitted to record in the Office of the Clerk of the United States to take amount of fifty Cents, being affixed thereto and duly Cancelled.
