This Deed made this 23rd day of February, one thousand, eight hundred and seventy, between R. A. Barrett of the one part, and Calcutt Everett chosen as Trustee, of the other part, Witnesseth that the said R. A. Barrett does grant (with general warranty unto the said Calcutt Everett, Successor aforesaid, the following property, to wit: One bay horse, 1 Mule, A head of Cattle, 8 hogs, one buggy & harness, 2 Cows and harness, and all increase of said stock, and his farming implements, also all Crops which the said R. A. Barrett may cultivate and raise during this present year (1870) up to the 1st of March, ground-taxes, Crops, fodder or other kind
 The Trustee, to stand the following Debts, to wit: To Wm. G. Myette administrator of Alex. Britt dec'd - the sum of \$197.46 due by said dec'd viz 23rd of December 1868, and payable ten months after date, with interest from date, and to stand Bond Wm. St. Daugherty and E. S. Britt and Security; To David Horner the sum of \$17.40 due by said dec'd 21st of March 1868, payable ten months after date, with interest from date and to which E. C. Ferguson and J. P. Soper are Security; To J. P. Jordan a Slave Accounts of about \$25.00 now or to be, and to E. D. Fells about \$79.00 due by said dec'd, with power to said Calcutt Everett the Trustee aforesaid to sell said property as the Law authorizes and after paying all legal charges, including a Commission of five per cent on said sales, pay the proceeds ratably to said Debtors

Whereas by a Verdict of the Grand Jury of Southampton County, made on the 7th day of November 1866, in the case above pending wherein A. H. Norfolk vs E. C. Clenduff and Sime Kello, Sheriff and Committee of Do. J.
