of the first part and Joshua Cutlow of the second part, Westerville; that is to say in Consideration
of the sum of Three Thousand dollars to the said Wm. R. Beans in hand paid by the said
Joshua Cutlow it and before the sealing and delivery of this Deed, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, the said William R. Beans doth hereby grant, bargains and
sells to the said Joshua Cutlow, one hundred and fifty or Morety of a certain tract of
Land lying in Southampton County, containing six hundred and forty two acres,
more or less, bounded by the Lands of Wm. C. Mapenburg of the Estate of
James Scott, Stephen Murdaugh and Joseph Murdaugh, it being the tract
of Land known as the Marl Hill parish, and sold by James H. Mapenburg on the
first of April 1856, to Adrian Cornell and the said William R. Beans, all of
which will more fully appear by reference to the said Deed of record in the
Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southampton, and the said William R. Beans
for himself, and heirs, doth so convey generally the title to the said hundred
and fifty or Morety of the said tract of Land to the said Joshua Cutlow.

The Indenture made this twenty-first day of March in the year 1870, between R. R.
Griffith and Alice A. his wife, of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, by
the first party, and Benj. Diford of the City of Baltimore, and State of Maryland, by
the second party; and Thomas S. Ford, B. P. Diford and J. F. Ely, partners doing business
under the name and style of Diford and Company, in the said City of Baltimore,
the third party, whereas, the said R. R. Griffith is justly indebted to the said Diford
and Company, in the sum of Sixteen thousand and Fifty dollars, being money of the
United States, and being so indebted, has this day executed and delivered to the
said Diford & Company two Notes by the first of which he has promised to pay to the
said Diford & Company, on the first day of January 1871, the sum of six
hundred and fifty dollars with lawful interest thereon from the date of said
Note until paid; and by the second by which he has promised to pay to the
said Diford & Company on the first day of January 1872, the sum of two
thousand dollars, with lawful interest thereon from the date thereof, until
paid; and the said R. R. Griffith desiring effectually to secure the punctual
payments of the said sums of money, and the interest which may accrue
thereon, when the several Notes aforesaid become due, This Indenture,
