 sixty two between Nathaniel Allmon and Ann his wife, and William C. C. C.
 In witness whereof in consideration of the sum of Two thousand dollars, the said Nathaniel
 Allmon, and Ann his wife, doth grant unto the said William C. C. C. the following
 tract or parcel of Land containing Two hundred and seventy acres, be the land
 more or less, and adjoining the Land of Benjamin Swanney, George Lawrence
 and others; also the whole of the personal Estate of Nathaniel and of the said
 William C. C. C. now in his possession and the said Nathaniel Allmon and
 Ann his wife, doth covenant generally the property above conveyed
 through the following Signatures and Seals.

This Deed made the 18th day of April in the year 1870, between James Holmes, (Seal)
 and George W. Harris the purchaser, Whereas James A. White on the 23rd day of December
 1857, by Deed which is duly recorded in the County Court of Southampton County did convey
 to James Holmes, (Seal) a certain tract or parcel of Land containing Two hundred and
 six and half acres, more or less, adjoining Blackwater River, John S. Brown,
 Robert Rufford, Lawrence Lusk and James W. Beale, in sum, to Second
 Matthew Harris in the sum of Two hundred and forty four (\$244.00)
 dollars with interest from the above date; and the said James Holmes,
 the Vendor, being there required by Matthew Harris, the (Seal) and
 aided by the Deed of Grant, aforesaid, did on the 1st day of November
 1869, sell to public auction for Cash, the tract of Land above described
 having given reasonable notice of the time and place of said sale, and
 the above named George W. Harris, became the purchaser of said
 tract of Land for the sum of Seven hundred and ten dollars (\$710.00)
 which was the highest bid made for the same—
 Now therefore the said James Holmes, (Seal) for and in consideration
 of the said sum of Seven hundred and ten dollars, doth grant unto
 the said George W. Harris the purchaser, with Special Covenants the
