 and Burgo H. Harris the purchaser, whereas Thomas Holmes & White on the 23rd day of December
 1864, by Deed which is duly recorded in the County Clerk of Suffolk County, did convey
 to James Holley, (Treasurer) a certain tract or parcel of Land Containing Two hundred and
 six and half acres, Mrs. or her, adjoining Blackwater River, John S. Reed,
 Robert Bradford, Lawrence Ladd and James W. Beale, in Trust, to deceased
 Matthew Harris in the sum of Two hundred and forty four (\$244.00)
 dollars, with interest from the above date, and the said James Holley,
 the Treasurer, being there required by Matthew Harris the Convinced
