

Whereas Alexander H. Stoffle did the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 1844, execute at Town of Hunt  
which was recorded in the Clerk's Office of the County of Culpeper, State of Virginia,  
Conveying to me Luther A. Edwards as Trustee, certain real Estate, consisting of  
certain parcels or lots of Land lying in the said County, among which was  
"the undivided Ninety of a Lot of ten acres of Land, with a Stone house  
thereon, situated at Boykin's Depot," in said County. The whole of said Lot  
having been bought jointly by Stoffle & Strohman; and otherwise by virtue  
of the power given to me the said Luther R. Edwards as trustee, the said  
real estate was sold by me the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 1845, and James  
M. Corlett having for the sum of One Thousand Two hundred and  
fifty two dollars & fifty Cents, become the purchaser of the  
aforesaid Ninety of the Lot situated at Boykin's Depot.  
Therefore by virtue of the power given to me as Trustee this Day  
Made the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April, One thousand Eight hundred  
and Twenty, between the aforesaid Luther A. Edwards grantor,  
of the first part, and James M. Corlett, grantee of the second  
part, both being of the aforesaid County & State, witnesseth in  
consideration of the above mentioned sum of One Thousand Two  
hundred & fifty two dollars and fifty Cents, paid to said  
Luther A. Edwards, he doth grant with special warranty,  
unto the said James M. Corlett, the aforesaid Ninety of  
the Lot of Land, situated at Boykin's Depot, in the said  
County and State, (the said Luther R. Edwards dying hereby  
leaving the title to him in his name and) now <sup>other</sup>  
from under his hand and seal this day and date above  
written.

This Inde Made the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1870, before E. J. Hill the grantor of the one  
part of the County of Southampton Vt. and E. B. Beaton, the Trustee of the other part  
Westwicke, that the said E. J. Hill, doth or do grant unto the said E. B. Beaton the sum  
of five hundred dollars, to be paid him in two equal annual payments, the first  
year after crop of Cotton, Corn, fodder, Peas &c., produced this year 1870, in the farm  
which I now reside; In trust, to secure a just due Beaton & Garrison - Vt.  
on open air due January 1<sup>st</sup> 1870 of Thirtieth four dollars & Eighty four cents,  
and interest till paid - also another open account due the said Beaton & Garrison  
this day of Twenty two dollars and thirty cents - Witness my hand and seal this  
12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1870 - Wm. H. Walter Bowes, E. W. Noddy E. J. Hill Seal
