Be and I do hereby certify that on the 9th day of June in the year 1870, between Francis F. Ridley,  
 Ben E. Cope, and Elizabeth A. Ridley his wife of the one part and William S. Goddard, (Consul) of  
 the other part, Witness, that the said Francis F. Ridley and wife Elizabeth A.  
 Ridley, do hereby unto the said William S. Goddard, (Consul) with general warranty,  
 the following property (to wit) two certain tracts or parcels of land and premises lying  
 in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, containing by  
 Estimation Twelve Hundred and Twenty Seven (1227) acres - to be the same more  
 or less, and adjoining the Lands of the late Peter Edwards dec'd - the heirs of  
 John A. Dorman dec'd and others and known as Francis F. Ridley's Mine farm,  
 also all of that portion of the said Francis F. Ridley's Lands lying west and  
 north of James Brown's Mill Run and Benj. C. Waller's Mill Run -  
 The Line beginning at follow, Commencing in a Branch the extreme South  
 end of the said Francis F. Ridley's line and at the head of James Brown's  
 Mill Run; the line thence running down said Brown's Mill Run to  
 the Mill Head, thence down Brown's Mill Stream to Benj. C. Waller's  
 Mill, thence down said Waller's Mill Stream or Angelica Swamp,  
 thence along said Swamp to the Crossroad and Belfield Road and  
 across said Road to its extent North, all the Lands owned by the said  
 Francis F. Ridley in Southampton County West and North of the herein described

 ted and agreed between the parties to this Deed that no Sale shall take  
 place under this Deed without the Consent of the said Francis F. Ridley  
 in life time I have ten years from its execution, and that when a Sale  
 does take place, thence on by Hierarchy, it shall be for Cash,  
 after giving at least thirty days notice of the time and place  
 of Sale, and the purchaser after paying the Costs and expenses of  
 this deed, shall be applied to the payment of the Debt and  
 Interests due the said Ben E. Cope.
