steps, one Cart and wheels to the said C. E. Johnson, his Executors, Administrators and
assigns, against me the said C. L. Story, my Executors, Administrators and assigns
and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant
not forever defend by these presents, provided always, that it is hereby agreed
between the said parties to these presents, that if I the said C. L. Story
my Executors, Administrators or assigns, or any of us do make with C.
Beale, or come to be paid unto the said C. E. Johnson or his C. Corbin, his
Executor, Administrators or assigns, the full sum of Sixty Six Dollars,
