This Deed made this 15th day of March 1870, between Leith H. Bishop
grantor of the one part, and Mary E. Shirley, grantee of the other part,
both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, Witnessed; That
in Consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars, received
by said Bishop from said Shirley, by the said Bishop doth grant
with general warranty unto the said Shirley the following real
estate to wit; a certain lot or parcel of Land in the County of
Southampton lying near Chincoteague Station on the Seaford and Roanoke
Rail Road, and adjoining the Chincoteague Mill tract, and bounded
as follows: Commencing at the head of the said Rail Road and
running in a southerly direction along Eastern boundary of the
Chincoteague Mill tract, thirtynine hundred and fifty feet, thence in a
southerly direction one hundred and thirty two feet, making a southerly
boundary at right angles with the before mentioned boundary into the
Story tract, thence in a southerly direction thirtynine hundred and
fifty feet, making a southerly boundary of ~~part~~ of the Story tract;
to the head of said Rail Road, thence in a southerly direction
one hundred and thirty two feet along the lands of Rail Road to
the points of Commencement—Containing by estimation four
acres, more or less, this lot of Land being a part of the tract
of Land now by said Bishop, known as the "Story tract or
place". And the said Bishop does hereby bind himself his heirs and
affees to forever defend the said herein contained to said
lot of Land, against the claimants whatsoever—But it is expressly
understood & agreed by the parties hereto, that the property with
the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars, due to the said
Leith H. Bishop, wife of the said Leith H. Bishop is retained in
trust to the said Leith H. Bishop the following signature and seal
