This Deed made this 15th day of March 1870, between Smith H. Bishop grantor of the one part, and Mary E. Staley, grantee of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, Whereof that in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars, received by said Bishop from said Staley, he the said Bishop doth grant unto general warranty unto the said Staley the following real Estate, to wit, a certain lot or parcel of Land in the County of Southampton lying near Port Henry Station in the East road and near the Rail Road, and adjoining the Port Henry Mill tract, and bounded as follows: Commencing at the head of the said Rail Road and running in a southerly direction along Eastern boundary of the Port Henry Mill tract, thence hundred and fifty feet, thence in a southerly direction one hundred & thirty two feet, thence in a southerly direction to right angles with the before mentioned boundary into the Mill tract, thence in a southerly direction thence hundred and fifty feet, thence in a southerly direction ^{Eastern} boundary of the Mill tract, to the Land of said Rail Road, thence in a southerly direction one hundred & thirty two feet along the corner of Rail Road to the point of Commencement - Containing by estimation four acres, more or less, this lot of Land being a part of the tract of Land owned by said Bishop, known as the "Mill tract or place" And the said Bishop doth hereby bind himself his heirs and assigns to defend the title herein conveyed to said lot of Land, against all Claimants whatsoever - But it is expressly understood & agreed by the parties hereto, that the prospective right of donor of Hardy wife of the said Smith H. Bishop is retained and reserved to the said Hardy wife following Signature and Seal
