It is hereby agreed that the portion of said fifty barrels of corn shall be taken by the Corp of Ordnance and shall not be sufficient to pay said debt. The said deBridenars does hereby waive his right to claims any of the above lands properly under the Homestead exemption or laws passed in pursuance thereof. Paine, to Charles of the second part, witnesses; that for and in consideration of the sum of \$1000.00 (one thousand dollars) to them paid in hand the receipt of which is Aug. 9, 1870. Nowly acknowledged the said Joseph W. Hart and Harriet A. his wife, do grant bargain and sell unto the said George W. Paine, all their rights, and title in a tract of Land lying in the County of Stafford State of Virginia, containing two hundred acres, more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit: front by the Norfolk and Petersburg Rail Road, the E. end by the Land belonging to the Estate of Charles Hart dec'd - on the South by the Lands of S. D. Rovers & on the East of Henry T. Bailey dec'd - and on the East by the Lands of the Estate of John Crampton dec'd - And the aforesaid parties Joseph W. Hart and his wife do hereby guaranty all the right and title here conveyed.
