To All whome it may Concern; Know all Men by these presents, that I, Stringer Gardner, of the County of Durham and State of Virginia, do declare & make known that I claim as holder and head of a family, do declare & make known that I claim as a Head and property exempt from levy and seizure, Sec. 22, under an act passed by the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled "an act to provide in what manner and on what conditions, a household or head of a family shall be exempt and hold a household and personal property for benefit of himself and family exempt from levy and seizure" passed June 27th 1870, the following real estate to wit: One tract of Land containing 281 acres, bounded by the Lands of J. P. Baber, James McBlaney, Jeremiah Chappell, Nancy Davis, & others; and the following personal property viz: 1 Bay Horse, 2 Head of Cattle, 2 Hogs, all my farming implements and household furniture, the valuation of said real estate and personal property hereby claimed not being over One thousand dollars, but valued at \$800.
