

This Indenture of Truth, Made this 23rd day of August 1870, between George W. Gray of the first part, Joseph B. Prince, Master of the 2nd part and Robt. S. Cope of the third part, of the State of Virginia; That the said George W. Gray for and in consideration of the sum after named premises, cash grants and convey unto the said Joseph B. Prince, the following personal property, to wit: five head of Cattle, twenty head of Hogs, and three mules, two Mares, two Mares Cows, farming implements of every description, two wagons and two horseless, household furniture and two thousand pounds of Salt Cattle; In Trust, however to secure & satisfy due by the said Geo. W. Gray to the said Robt. S. Cope by bond of date March 7th 1870, for Two Hundred dollars, but from date And it is agreed by the said parties to this Indenture, that whenever the Trust shall be satisfied, he shall deliver up and apply the proceeds of said, according to Law. Whereas a Marriage is hereby intended to be made and solemnized by the said Joseph B. Prince of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the one part and Virginia Bono of the County of Stafford and State of North Carolina of the other part; and whereas it has been agreed that the said Virginia Bono should release all right to dower or distribution in the Estate of the said Joseph B. Prince; And This Indenture, Made this day of November 1870, between the said Joseph B. Prince and Virginia Bono, of the County of Stafford; That in consideration of the premises the said parties (both and the age of twenty one,) Covenant and agree together, do with the other, as follows to wit: The said Virginia Bono, that she will and doth hereby release, relinquish and abandon all claim or right to dower or distribution and all interest either at Law or in Equity, in any property now owned or hereafter to be acquired by the said Joseph B. Prince, real, personal or mixed, to which she could have had title had she survived him but for this Covenant and the said Joseph B. Prince, that if the said Virginia Bono should survive him then that his Executors shall out of his Estate so soon as practicable the sum of \$1000.00 Dollars to be held by him in fee simple, and further that he will and enjoy during life the same known as the
